Embracing Opportunity RABBI MORDECHAI PALGON, שליט"א

In Parshas Toldos, Esav sells his bechorah to Yaakov in return for a bowl of lentil soup cooked after the levaya of Avrohom Avinu. In the course of their conversation about the sale, Yaakov explained the responsibilities of the bechorah, including the various detailed halachos and accompanying consequences of any misstep. Once Esav realized that not fulfilling these obligations would lead a bechor to his death, he immediately released himself from them by selling them to Yaakov. His reasoning for selling this part of himself is "הנה אנֹכי הוֹלך למות ולמה זה לי בכרה" What use is this to me when I'll die anyway?

The Torah records his reaction as "זיבו נגישו את הבלרה", Esav degraded the bechora. One can ask what did Esav do that was so terrible? He seems to have done the right thing: he acknowledged his limitations and realized that he couldn't fulfill this role. With the sale of the bechorah to Yaakov, he was preserving it for someone who could do it properly.

R' Moshe Feinstein zt'l answers that when it comes to kavod shamayim, if an achrayus falls into your lap, it is our obligation to step up. It is not our job to say I don't want to because someone else might be able to do it better or we might attract the ire of others for the way it was accomplished.

Esav had every good reason to pass the responsibilities of the bechor along to Yaakov, but that was not his job. Giving up a job that is for kavod Shamayim is a bizayon, degrading, to the responsibility a person is given. Our job is to step up and embrace the achrayus in the best way we know how.

Oils Allowed for **Shabbos & Chanukah**

One is allowed to use any type of oil or wick for the menorah even though the oil may not burn easily or even if the wick may not draw the oil well. However, the same cannot be said for Shabbos candles, as Shabbos candles have different requirements for what type of candle can be used. Shabbos candles need to have oil and wicks that produce a clean pure light that doesn't flicker.

The Mishnah Berurah explains that the difference between Chanukah and Shabbos is due to the fact that it is forbidden to use the Menorah light for personal use, and on Shabbos, the Mitzvah is to have light that is useable. On Shabbos, if the light is not lit well, or the oil is not drawing towards the wick, we are afraid that a person will try to fix the candle on Shabbos which is prohibited. As opposed to Chanukah, the light is not able to be used, and we are not afraid that a person will try to fix the candle.

Because it is prohibited to use the Chanukah Menorah for personal use, the Shulchan Aruch says that it is proper to light a Shammash with the Menorah so any benefit that comes from the Menorah will be attributed to the Shammash.

It's Never Elementary, **My Dear Talmid**

Eisev is the picture that a child has of the ultimate *rasha*. Eisev's evil nature, even before his birth, and his fiery, red anger make him look like the ultimate devil. Yet, if you delve into our Chazal, you see that the only devil is in the details.

We find in Chazal that Eisev was exceptional in the mitzvah of *kibbud* av v'aim. So much so that the *Amoraim* in the *Gemorah* looked up to him in this area. But, it is hard to explain how there's room for envy from a full-fledged *rasha*. Rav Issac Sher of Slabodka makes the picture even more confusing. He understands from Chazal that Eisev was exceptional in other areas of avodas Hashem too, not just kibbud

av. This would better explain Yitzchok's perspective of prominence for this son over Yaakov Avinu. So how do we explain Eisev Harasha according to this? Rav Issac is michadesh that if we were to meet Eisev, we would be convinced he was a *tzadik* too. His faults were so camouflaged in a complex human being, that looked as frum as you, that it would be almost impossible to perceive. This is far from the picture that you understood in the elementary school Eisev.

Eisev is an important lesson for understanding life as an oved Hashem. Most of the time life isn't black and white, purely kosher or clearly treif. There are complex challenges that have to be measured with a deep Torah understanding. To write things off with simple superlatives is the sin of superficiality. Hashem wants us to embrace our decisions with Havana, understanding, and hachna'a, submission to our Chachomim. Only then will we rise above our Elementary Eisev education.

POWERFUL PRAYER

Dear Parents,

As the war in Gaza continues, our focus remains on Tefila; the prayers of each individual and the Klal together are of paramount importance. Davening is a challenge for adults and children alike and maintaining enthusiasm week after week is not an easy task. With a greater appreciation for the power of Tefila, we may actually be able to capitalize on the current tragic and frightening circumstance to propel our and our children's Tefila to a much higher level.

In the beginning of our Parsha, the Torah tells us that Yitzchak Avinu's impassioned and relentless prayers for himself and Rivka Imeinu to have a child were answered. (Bereishis 25:21, Rashi). It apparently took passion and constant Tefila to achieve the desired result. One doesn't stop davening as long as his goal remains possible vet elusive.

An additional insight into Tefila can be gleaned from an incident brought in Melachim Beis (6:15-17). The Navi recounts an incident where the king of Aram was attacking Klal Yisrael with the intent of kidnapping the Navi Elisha. The pesukim describe how Elisha's attendant saw the vast army surrounding their city, and did not perceive that there was much of a defense on the side of the Bnei Yisrael. When he expressed his great concern to Elisha, the response from Elisha was not to worry - we have many more soldiers and armaments than our enemy.

The next pasuk describes how Elisha davened that his attendant's eyes would be opened to see what he was talking about. The servant then saw the mountainside filled with Jewish soldiers and chariots, surrounding and protecting Elisha. The soldiers were actually angels! The Malbim and other *Meforshim* explain that the soldiers and the armaments were created by Elisha's Tefilos - they were spiritual creations that emerged as real soldiers and weapons on the battlefield.

Rabbi Yisrael Reisman, Shlita, elaborates on this idea to show even more vividly how angels are created by our Tefilos and in accordance with the quality of our Tefilos. At Akeidas Yitzchak, In the pasuk where the Malach tells Avraham not to sacrifice Yitzchak (Bereishis 22:12), the Malach continues to tell Avraham that now he, the

Malach, knows that Avraham is G-d fearing: because you Avraham did not withhold (sacrificing) your son from me. The Vilna Gaon, as quoted by Rabbi Reisman, questions why the Malach says "from me." It should say "from Hashem."

The Gra (Vilna Gaon) explains that a Malach is created from every prayer, every good deed. However, not all *Malachim* are the same. Some are strong, robust, enthusiastic. Others are lethargic, weak, incomplete. What causes the difference? The enthusiasm and passion with which we davened, performed mitzvos and did chasodim. Focused, passionate prayer will create a strong, robust Malach. Distracted, rushed and mindless davening will create an incomplete, ineffective Malach.

This explains why Avraham's Malach said - "you did not withhold from me." The Malach knew he was complete, strong and whole. He therefore knew that what created him was a level of Yiras Shomayim that was extremely lofty.

As we struggle to help our children make davening meaningful, this message can be very powerful. Each word of Tefila recited correctly and with sincerity creates a Malach, another soldier in the Army of Klal Yisrael. How we do with our davening vields direct results on the battlefield, on all battlefields and confrontations. We have the power to create additional soldiers, greater firepower to defend Klal Yisrael. What greater motivation do we need to work on improving our davening!

May we all, parents and children, work hard on our davening and mitzvos, which is the greatest contribution we can make to ensure the safety and well-being of Acheinu Bnei Yisrael and help bring the Geulah Shelaima.
