# Amongst But Separate RABBI MORDECHAI PALGON, שליט"א

The very last pasuk in Parshas Vayigash explains that וישב ישראל בארץ גשן מצרים בארץ גשן. Bnei Yisroel lived in the land of Goshen which is in the land of Mitzrayim. Many ask the question: why does the Torah need to repeat the information that Goshen was in Mitzrayim? We already know from previous pesukim that Goshen was in Mitzrayim. Is it not enough to just say they lived in Goshen without qualifying its location?

Rav Moshe Feinstein explains that the reason there is repetition is to teach us that sometimes Bnei Yisroel has to live in galus because Hashem puts us in that place, but a Jew must always exert effort not to live amongst the goyim. Jews should work to separate themselves in distance and in action. When we are in galus, we build institutions and entertainment that are separate to avoid undue influence from the secular society, even as far back as Mitzrayim. Everything for the Jews was in Goshen and not in Mitzrayim, both geographically and culturally.

Rabbi Sholom Rubashkin tells a story that what saved him when he went into prison was his mindset. He held onto the idea that a person has a neshama and a body. If a person embraces his neshama, only his body is imprisoned but his neshama remains free. We are in galus, but if our neshama is embracing Hashem by following the Torah and mitzvos, our neshamos will not be.

# Fasting On Shabbos DAVID FRYDMAN BMZE, 2nd Year Talmid

It is forbidden to fast on Shabbos. Fasting in this context refers to either not eating or drinking for any amount of time with the intent of fasting, or not eating or drinking until חצות (midday) even without intent to fast. The second example of fasting can be a problem for someone who goes to a later minyan on Shabbos and the minyan doesn't finish until after חצת. If someone wants to make sure that they keep the Halacha of not fasting on Shabbos, they should make sure to eat something before מצות.

There is a מחלוקת in the poskim as to whether a person can drink in order to consider it as if he didn't fast. Some poskim question whether any liquid works to "break your fast" on Shabbos. The Aruch Hashulchan rules that a hot beverage works to break your fast, but a cold beverage or water does not work. R' Ovadia Yosef rules that a person can break his fast with water and it is even לכתחילה to do so.

# Simple Words, Complicated Impact

He had all the cards in his hands. After an illegal abduction, he now had their beloved son as a hostage. How could the family break through and redeem him? This storyline doesn't come from the current headline but rather from this week's parsha.

Yehuda got the seemingly evil tyrant of Egypt to break. The Medrash (Parshas Vayigash 93:4) explains the secret of Yehuda's triumph. It lies within understanding the depth of human nature. Rav Shmuel Berenbaum (Tiferes Shmuel) explains that even though the Shevatim got Yosef to cry in private, they didn't break

him. It was just Yehuda's simple straightforward words which finally pushed Yosef over the edge. Rav Shmuel explains that you see from here how complex human dynamics are. It's not necessarily the surefire, emotional plea which motivates a person. It may be just another simple sentiment that will shake him.

This yesod is so important in interpersonal relationships, especially for parents and children, Rebbeim and their talmidim. You never know when your simple words will make an impact. Don't be discouraged when your well-rehearsed presentation seems to be ignored. Simple words in a different scenario and setting could sometimes penetrate even the most fortified defenses.

# New **Old Reality**

Dear Parents,

Many Jews, secular ones in particular, are bemoaning the new reality that has been thrust upon us since *Simchas Torah*. The explosion of antisemitic acts and words in the public arena of this country are a great cause of concern for all of us. It would be helpful to get a perspective in understanding what might be underlying these events and perhaps a glimpse as to what message *Hashem* may be sending us. **During our long and bitter Galus, we have been in dangerous and uncertain situations many times**, so what we are experiencing is, unfortunately, not something unprecedented.

After receiving and accepting the startling and most welcome news that *Yosef* was still alive, *Yaakov Avinu* lead his family on their journey down to *Mitzrayim* to reunite with *Yosef*. *Hashem* appears to *Yaakov* in a vision to tell him not to fear leaving *Eretz Yisrael* and settling temporarily in Egypt, "... because I will make you into a great nation there." (Bereishis 46:3).

The Seforno comments that Hashem is informing Yaakov that were he and his children to stay in Canaan, they would end up intermarrying with the local inhabitants and becoming assimilated. However, in Egypt, where "the Egyptians are not able to eat bread together with the Hebrews," Yaakov's family would be forcibly separated and thereby not be susceptible to intermarriage. It was only in Egypt that Yaakov's family could develop into a separate nation.

It is astounding to think that the great sons of Yaakov and their children would be unable to remain distinct and separate from the lowly Canaanites surrounding them. With their great mesorah from Avraham, Yitzchak and Yaakov it seems unfathomable that merely being in proximity to a welcoming and accepting culture and environment could sway them from their powerful roots. Nevertheless, that is the clear message that the Seforno tells us Hashem was conveying to Yaakov.

The great *chesed* and open and welcoming environment that always was America, has unfortunately already swallowed up millions of our fellow Jews. We are both blessed and cursed to live in a country where our rights are protected by law to the same degree as every other citizen. It has stood us in good stead and enabled us to rebuild our world from the ashes of the Holocaust. But the goodness comes with a price; a price that has already been paid by so many of our brothers and sisters who have assimilated and been lost to the Jewish people.

Hashem has promised He will not allow the Jewish people to disappear and He takes measures to ensure that. It has been observed that when the Jews fail to separate sufficiently from the surrounding non-Jews, the non-Jews separate themselves from the Jews, many times causing us great pain and suffering. The great European Rosh Yeshiva, Harav Boruch Ber

Leibowitz zt'l who visited the United States in the 1930's is quoted as having said: "In America, the Jews know how to make Kiddush, they do not know how to make Havdala." His point was that the Jewish community was very open and accepting of differences among Jews and between Jews and non-Jews. What they failed in was creating the proper barriers and separations from non-Jews, to protect against intermarriage and assimilation.

Without a Navi, a prophet, to interpret what is really happening today, we can only conjecture as to Hashem's plan. It would not be unreasonable to suggest that Hashem is letting us know that we are getting too comfortable in our surroundings, too close with the non-Jewish culture and environment. We are falling short in our Havdala, therefore Hashem is causing the people around us to decide that the Jews are too integrated, too much a part of them and it's time to make that separation, perhaps painfully.

This message needs to be internalized and transmitted to our children. We are different and we are special. We already invest heavily in maintaining our distinctiveness. *Shabbos, Kashrus,* going to shul, attending Yeshiva, are all lifestyle choices we have made that we and our children are okay with and celebrate. But, the areas of dress, entertainment, pursuit of pleasure, drive for affluence and immersion in secular media and culture all represent a more subtle challenge to our being a separate people, distinct from those surrounding us.

We all need to continue developing greater pride in the uniqueness that an allencompassing Torah life engenders, even though being visibly different from those around us may make us somewhat uncomfortable and apprehensive at this time. The Jews' desire to fit in and be a part of society, is apparently not being reciprocated by the non-Jews. This message is being cruelly thrown at us with increasing frequency. May we and our children heed the message, stand tall and resolute with gaavah d'kedusha, pride in our holiness and distinctiveness and thereby be protected from the Havdala of the Goyim. As we continue to daven for the welfare of our brothers and sisters in Eretz Yisrael, may we also be spared further harm. May we grow stronger and prouder of our special status as the Am Hanivchar, the chosen people of Hashem.
