A MESSAGE FROM THE ROSHEI HAYESHIVA



A Paragon of **Derech Eretz**

The Pasuk says ויקרא אל משה...מאהל מועד לאמר... The Medresh Raba comments that from here we see כל תלמיד חכם שאין בו דעת נבלה טובה ממנו, a dead carcass is better than a Talmid Chochom without derech eretz. Moshe Rabeinu displayed clear derech eretz when he did not go into the Ohel Moed until Hashem called him. It seems clear that Moshe Rabbeinu had the right to go in when it was completed; he was the premier of Nevi'im, involved in all of the miracles in Mitzravim and the Yam Suf, and who went up to shamayim to get the Torah. He clearly had the credentials to make the decision of going into the Ohel Moed when it was ready.

Yet, even with all of his involvement in the collection of materials, the construction of the Mishkan, and all of the preparation of the Kohanim, he did not feel any presumption of further involvement to go in until he was called. His dedication to derech eretz and heeding Hashem negated every other qualification. Had he gone in one second too early, before Hashem called him to come in, even such an august person as Moshe would be reduced to less than a putrid and repugnant carcass. One second differentiated the greatness of Moshe Rabbeinu from the lowest and most disgusting of remains.

The Sefer Torah that was just dedicated and celebrated in Yeshiva is in honor of the life of my father, whose Rebbe was R' Moshe Feinstein zt'l, a paragon of middos tovos and derech eretz. As great as R' Moshe was as a the posek of the generation and in his genius, nothing paralleled his middos and how he treated everyone around him with the greatest respect. His influence is still keenly felt within my family, and the importance of such behavior is clearly illustrated in this week's Parsha.





Mishloach Manos AVRAMI FLAMHOLTZ

There is a mitzvah on Purim to give משלח מנות. This means that every person needs to give two food items to another person. A common misconception about משלח מנות is that the two food items need to be different brachos. When the משלח מנות says the halacha of משלח, the example of two food items that the שלחן ערוך gives is two portions of meat. Two portions of meat are the same bracha, so we clearly see that they can be the same bracha.

The משנה ברורה has a doubt as to whether a person needs to fulfill the mitzvah of משלח משלח through a שליח (messenger). Therefore, it is preferable to fulfill the mitzvah by sending the food to another using a middleman. The משנה מברורה also has a doubt if you need to give a חשוב portion of food. This would mean that a person may not be able to give a small piece of candy as משנה משנה ברורה says that since there is a doubt, at least one of the משלח that you give should be a חשוב portion of food.

The Gadlus Of Chessed

Mordechai did not miss a day. For several years, day in and day out, he would visit and check up on Esther who was trapped in the deceiving grandeur of a jail called "the King's Palace." The Medrash (Esther Rabba 6:8) credits these actions of Mordechai as the defining factors which led to him being Divinely appointed as the leader of the Jewish people. But one might ask what was so unique about Mordechai's actions that our Chazal highlight? Wouldn't anyone reach out to help a damsel in distress? How can you not assist Esther, especially if she is a yesoma and a member of your family. So what's the big deal about Mordechai's actions?

In the Slabodka Yeshiva they revolutionized the definition of chessed. The Alter of Slabodka (Ohr Hatzafon) taught that chessed This Purim we can send Slabodka Mishloach Manos. It doesn't isn't merely fulfilling the needs of the underprivileged. Chessed goes way beyond that. It is emulating the middah of Hashem. Olam

chessed yibone, Hashem created a world full of chessed. He did so, not because there was any need, as nothing yet existed to require it. Rather, He created it because of His desire to do good. This comes from an infinite trait of chessed. So too, we have to give to others, not just because they are needy, but rather because we want to do good. This chessed of Slabodka exemplifies itself not just in the extent of the chessed, which goes beyond the boundaries of the needs of the recipient, but also in the flavor and focus of the giving. It is an infinite desire to do good.

Perhaps this can also explain Mordechai's rise to gadlus as the leader of the Jewish people. His daily chessed of caring for Esther wasn't just about fulfilling her physical and emotional needs. It was an infinite middah of chessed, to just do good for another person. This middah knows no boundaries. Such a person can care for others, not just the one person in their circle. Their chessed knows no boundaries.

Shhh - It's A Secret!

Dear Parents.

Much of life and Yiddishkeit consists of balancing conflicting values and attempting to come out on the right side of what Hashem wants us to do in any situation. Sharing private information and revealing secrets is an area that presents one of the most challenging scenarios for adults and children. The imperative of confidentiality collides with the need for information to help someone. Which way to go is indeed a thorny auestion.

At the very beginning of this week's Parsha and of the entire Sefer Vayikra, the pasuk (Vayikra 1:1) says: And Hashem called to Moshe, and He spoke to him from the Ohel Moed, saying. The next Pasuk then continues to Hashem's words and begins: Speak to the Bnei Yisroel... The Gemora in Yoma (4B) is troubled by the inclusion of the word לאמר saying at the end of the first Pasuk. The Torah seemingly should only have said: And Hashem called to Moshe from the Ohel Moed. Next Pasuk then states - Speak to the Bnei Yisroel. What does "saying" add to the point of the Pasuk, if immediately afterwards Hashem openly tells Moshe to speak?

The Gemora, as explained by Rashi, says to read the word אמר, saying, as לא making the word in fact a contraction "do not say." Rashi's explanation is that the word לאמר really is not needed in the Pasuk for its simple meaning, it is in fact coming to teach something else. That is - Derech Eretz, proper behavior. In this case it is "Don't Say." Moshe Rabbeinu was being told not to reveal the words of Hashem - "don't say" until he received permission to "Speak to the Bnei Yisroel."

When it comes to private information, it is not proper to share it with others. If the person sharing with you tells you directly that it is a secret, not to reveal it, then we are commanded to not reveal it. A basic truism in human relations is that people are drawn to each other when there is a feeling of trust between them. If one feels the other is possibly or likely to share a private conversation, that relationship will never develop into anything deep or meaningful. Even information that is not potentially harmful or painful and would not qualify as Lashon Hara, should nevertheless not be shared without permission.

When it comes to the parent-child relationship, as it relates to information that is private or secret, the guidelines become extremely complex. Many things take place in the confines of one's home that should not be shared outside of the family. Many things take place outside of the home, that family members feel comfortable sharing with each other, perhaps inappropriately. Young children don't yet know how to keep a secret and they need to be taught that by their parents through words and role modeling. On the flip side, parents need to know what is going on in their child's life to keep him or her safe - physically, spiritually and emotionally.

To properly navigate this balancing act, parents need to understand the parameters of Toeles - which means "a positive purpose or benefit." There are circumstances when secrets need to be revealed and Lashon Hara must be said, in order to protect someone from harm. When it comes to sharing information about children, many of us adults are not sufficiently careful to speak only in cases of Toeles. On the other hand, many parents and teachers have been almost too effective in teaching their children and students about Lashon Hara, and children then don't share vital information with a trusted adult, that is needed to prevent harm from coming to them or someone else.

There are no shortcuts in navigating this vitally important area of Halacha and interpersonal relations. Knowledge of Hilchos Loshon Hara, adopting an overall approach to not sharing confidential information with others, and gently, carefully and consistently explaining to one's children what information should and should not be shared and with whom, are keys to properly train our children. Helping them habituate behavior in accordance with Halacha will not only build their Avodas Hashem, it will enable them to build and maintain trusting, deep and meaningful, long-lasting relationships in their lives.
