

### Occupational Therapy Services

Occupational therapists work with people of all ages to help them participate in activities or occupations that are meaningful to them. For children, these activities are the means through which they learn, play, and develop life skills.

Children who are unable to perform certain activities, such as building a block tower, completing a puzzle, coloring, or cutting may have underlying developmental issues that are impacting their ability to learn. Occupational therapists intervene to address these difficulties as early as possible in order to ensure that this child can reach his/her full learning potential in the future.

Some of the specific areas that occupational therapists assess are gross motor skills, fine motor skills, visual perception, play skills, emotional regulation, and sensory integration (the way the child interprets environmental stimuli, such as touch, smells, tastes, movements, and auditory information).

Furthermore, occupational therapists address handwriting issues, which can result from many varying underlying issues such as poor posture, weak fine motor skills, poor visual spatial skills, or other sensory processing difficulties.

Occupational therapy screening is offered through the Yeshiva, to students in Klurman Elementary School and the Early Childhood Division, in order to identify children who may require intervention. Please complete the form below if you would like to have your child screened. The screenings take place during the first few weeks of school. The therapist will contact you before the screening exam is scheduled.
