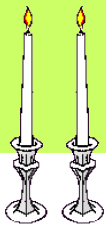
## WELCOME BACK!

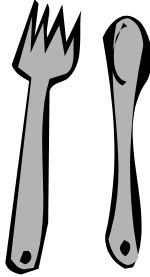

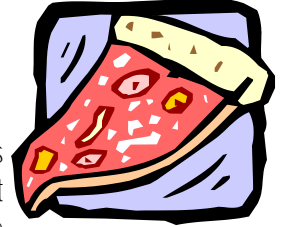
## NO GLASS BOTTLES

## PIZZA & CANTEEN

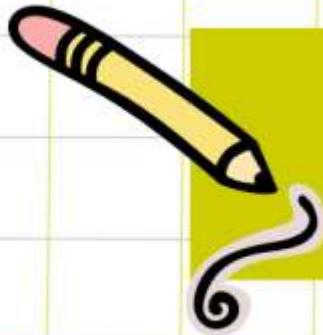

### Whatever It Takes

By the time he entered sixth grade, Eli, the oldest child, was able to wake up to his alarm clock at 6:30 each morning, get dressed, pack his knapsack and catch the 7 a.m. bus that took him to his school's minyan. So his mother was quite surprised when the next son, Moshe, reached sixth grade. Moshe required his own personal repeated wake-up calls, a pre-davening cup of cocoa and a great deal of coaxing. And still he missed the minyan several times a week. Yet, by the time Moshe reached bar mitzvah, all balkiness had disappeared. He rushed out the door with a "Bye, Ma!" and was off to daven.

Sixth grade was the point at which the school required the boys to begin attending minyan, but it was by no means the universal point at which each boy was ready for the responsibility. For some, an internalized desire to daven didn't develop until high school. For others, it didn't happen until they had children of their own.

And so it is with every aspect of spiritual growth; each person must ascend spiritually at his own rate. The proof

comes from a verse in Vayikra in which we learn that the Kohen must use a ramp, rather than stairs, when he ascends to the altar to bring a sacrifice.

In a flight of stairs, every step lifts you by a pre-set, pre-measured increment, and each person ascends in the same increments. But spiritual growth is not like that. A person may be able to rise eight inches in one stride,

Levi didn't like to stir up trouble. He tried to accept every person for who he was, and to overlook the occasional injustices that came his way. His inner landscape was one of blue skies and rolling hills.

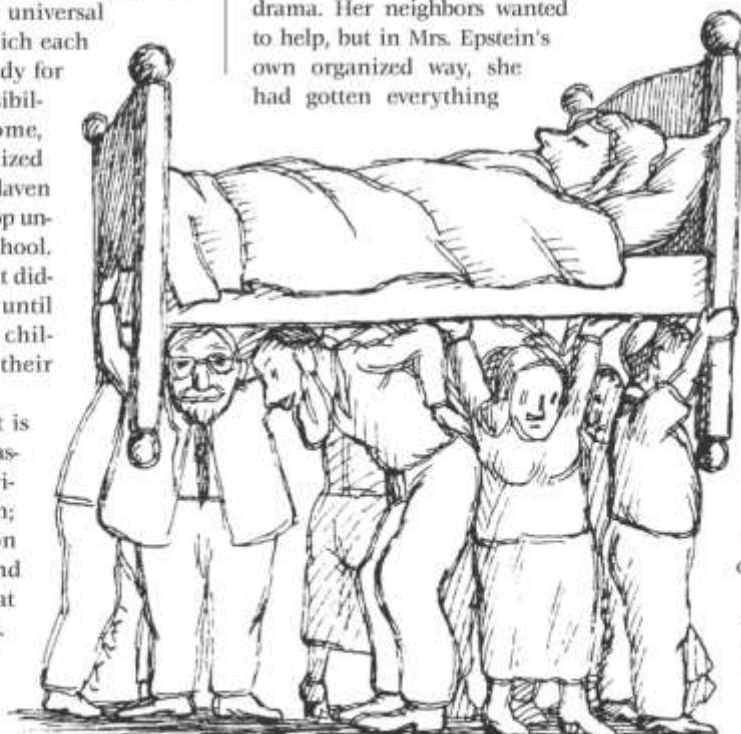
Levi's wife Rivka was also a contented, sunny person, but one thing shook her equanimity. She hated to see strife of any kind. Rifts between friends, family feuds, heated shul politics—they all made Rivka feel unsettled. Often, her discomfort drove her to take the initiative in fixing the situation.

"Be like Aaron the Kohen. Love peace and pursue peace," Pirkei Avos instructs. Like Levi, most people love peace; it's the most emotionally comfortable state. But to be like Aaron, one must love peace as a separate entity. One must long for the measure of peace in the world to increase. That love for peace turns a person into a pursuer of peace, a person who can't endure the presence of strife anywhere in his world, and will do his best to repair the rift.

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# Do Something

The new boss couldn't have been less popular. All of a sudden, a free-wheeling office full of computer geniuses—people who might easily show up at 10 p.m. and work until dawn if that's when an idea hatched—was on a time-clock. "Nine to 5:30 with a half-hour for lunch," said the hated memo.

The schedule was only one aspect of a whole regime to "professionalize" the office. Discontent was festering within the ranks. Loshon hora was churning in every cubicle. The seething anger was bringing out the worst in everyone.

Finally, Ezra Weinstock, a recent addition to the staff, knew something had to be done. He called each of 15 co-

workers that evening and pointed out that the situation was dragging them all down, spiritually and emotionally.

"To start with, we've got to agree to cut out the loshon hora," Ezra urged. "And then, we've got to get the boss to meet with us so we can try to accommodate each others' needs."

The next day, the situation began to improve. The conversations lost their bitter edge, and soon, some productive ideas were in the air. The staff appointed a few delegates to bring their ideas to the new boss, and he was, much to everyone's surprise, receptive.

"In a place where there are no men, strive to be a man," Pirkei Avos tells us. This is what Ezra Weinstock did. Rather than defaulting to his worst

instincts, he summoned what was best in himself. Rather than helplessly watching a poisoned atmosphere engulf his workplace, he took it upon himself to clear the air. He was only one person, but sometimes, one person is all it takes.

ever, Hashem had not decreed suffering for the entire neighborhood. Now, in order to restore the proper balance, Hashem had no choice but to grant Mrs. Epstein a recovery.

Therein lies the reason one person's prayer has an impact on another person's recovery. By taking someone else's suffering as our own, we change the balance and sometimes, we change the outcome as well.

# The Layover

Reb Yankel Zaretzki spent his life in learning—first in Kletzk, later as a talmid of Rav Aharon Kotler in Lakewood, and then at Kollel Chazon Ish. His career veered off the usual track for his small town—a few years of cheder and then apprenticeship in a trade—because of a young kollel man who stopped by his cheder during a layover between trains.

The young man was the then-unknown Rav Elazar Menachem Mann Shach, zt'l. To him, there was no better use of a few hours than to find the local cheder and see how the boys were learning. He found some of them promising, but the rebbe admitted that none of them would be likely to continue learning. The young man asked to meet immediately with the boys' parents. He spoke to them from his heart, conveying the urgent need to instill Torah in the new generation. He convinced six parents to allow their sons to keep learning, eventually following him to Kletzk, and in one quick layover, brought six talmidei chachomim to the world.
