





Dear Parents,

Perhaps the most distressing aspect of raising children, for those parents blessed with two or more children, is the inability of their children to get along with each other. Sibling rivalry can tear at the fabric of a happy home, and many parents simply are at a loss of what to do. Their sweet, charming children are so good at almost everything, except being kind and patient with each other.

The situation may seem even more perplexing, when parents become aware that outside the house, the children will stand up for each other to the nth degree. Before you dismiss that phenomenon as just another proof that your kids are out to get you, think about the fact that they are actually following in the footsteps of *Avraham Avinu*.

**This week's Parsha** details the relationship and subsequent falling-out between *Avraham* and his nephew and brother-in-law, *Lot*. This was not mere family trouble – this was a clash of ideology that compelled *Avraham* to separate from his nephew. And yet, despite this estrangement, when *Avraham* heard that *Lot* was captured in battle, *Avraham* put his life in danger in order to attempt to save *Lot*.

*Rabbi Herschel Becker*, in his *Sefer, Love Peace*, points out that ***Avraham's*** attitude towards *Lot* was based not on ***Lot's*** failings, but that he was a brother. He relates the story of *Rav Chaim Ozer Grodzenski zt'l*, leader of Lithuanian Jewry between the two World Wars, who once excused himself from a meeting of the most distinguished Rabbis of the time, to converse with a relative, a simple man who came calling. When asked to explain his actions, *Rav Chaim Ozer* cited the *Halacha* that while a distinguished person may be allowed to turn aside from picking up a lost article worth only a penny, when it comes to showing compassion for a relative, there is no such dispensation. He quoted the *Pasuk* in *Yeshaya (58:7)* that states: *From your flesh, you may not turn aside*. You are obligated to be there for your relative.

**No matter the health of your children's relationship with each other inside the family**, you should focus on and stress this idea that brothers (and sisters) are there for each other. If they are loyal to each other outside the home – celebrate this most important trait. **If they're not loyal even** outside, encourage them and teach them the lesson of *Avraham Avinu* – loyalty is not dependent on behavior, but on family bond that is precious and most worthy of strengthening in any way possible.

May your *Shabbos* be peaceful and well-connected,

It seemed like a simple enough job—organizing a small Shalosh Seudos for the shul. Each week, a different family would sponsor. What could be so hard? It became complicated on Week Two, when two families wanted to sponsor in honor of a yahrtzeit. First-come, first-served seemed like the safest principle to apply, but the second-come family was a bastion of the shul, while the first-comers were only peripherally involved.

"We always take Parshas Noach," said the second family. "If they were ever around here, they'd know that."

Then came the hashgachah problems. One faction of shul insisted on changing bakeries, while another was loyal to the current one, owned by the shul treasurer's cousin.

Somehow, Yossi Klein, the unsuspecting Shalosh Seudos coordinator, managed to soothe all the ruffled feathers and keep the tables resplendent in herring and egg salad each week.

Community service of any kind has its perils. The personal price of juggling details, egos and round-the-clock phone calls is enough to make most people eschew the glory in favor of a little peace. But Hashem provides special protection to those who take on these tasks. Following the prayer Yikum Purkan, said after the Shabbos Torah reading, the congregation prays for those who serve it: "and remove from them every affliction, heal their entire body and forgive their every iniquity."

The unusual formulation of this prayer implicitly acknowledges the toll on those who serve. They may make mistakes, they may inadvertently

insult someone, they may find themselves taxed physically. But there's compensation. Those who put themselves on the line for the benefit of Klal Yisrael take on a unique burden, and in return, Hashem encircles them with a unique shield of protection that turns the source of stress into a source of blessing.

## Effective Prayer

### Bestowing Our Blessing

In a fascinating passage in the Talmud, we learn that the High Priest, R' Yishmael, entered the Holy of Holies on Yom Kippur and heard Hashem's voice saying, "My child Yishmael, bless Me." R' Yishmael responded: "May Your mercies overcome Your wrath, and may You conduct Yourself with compassion toward Your children." The blessing pleased Hashem.

This blessing also opens up a new understanding of the meaning of blessings in general. The mystifying "baruch atah Hashem" with which blessings begin is usually translated to mean that Hashem is the Source of all

blessings. It seems ludicrous to interpret the phrase to mean that we, mere human beings, are "blessing" Hashem.

But the story of R' Yishmael gives us a different understanding. We see from here that our mitzvos and our teshuvah are indeed blessings to Hashem, for they enable Him to act in accordance with His nature, showering goodness upon His children. When we render ourselves deserving of this goodness, we are actually giving something of value to Hashem.

# Why Try?

Unbelievably, Zahava Cohen wanted to get married. To Rivka Nussbaum, it seemed like only yesterday that the Nussbaums moved in next door to the Cohens, a newly-wed couple with one little toddler –Zahava– and a sibling on the way. Over the years, the families became so close that some neighbors weren't sure which children belonged to which house.

Now Zahava was looking for her bashert. With all her heart, Rivka wanted to be the one to make the match. She made phone call after phone call. She suggested one young man after another, but none were Mr. Right. Then one day, Zahava flew through Rivka's front door in a flush of excitement: she

was engaged! To whom? Her dental hygienist's brother.

For a moment, Rivka's joy at the good news rang a little hollow. "I worked so hard for nothing," she thought.

On the surface, it would seem that Rivka was right—all her efforts had achieved nothing. But the Torah tells us that this is not so. It brings the example of Moshe, who was com-

manded to form a menorah out of gold for use in the Mishkan. The Torah records Moshe's frustrations in trying to meet Hashem's specifications. Finally, Hashem told Moshe to cast the gold into the fire, and the menorah was formed by a miracle.

The Maharal of Prague explains that Moshe's efforts—even though they didn't succeed—were a prerequisite to

Hashem's miracle. "All actions which come from Above require effort from man below," he states.

Even efforts that bear no direct fruit have immeasurable value. Sometimes, we are like the person who toils at opening the jar lid; our efforts loosen it, so that the next person who tries gets to hear that satisfying "pop" of success.

Dinnertime at the Rosens resembled a typical day in small claims court—a never-ending parade of misdeeds and counter-arguments that sloshed across the table with the speed of spilled Coke. And all of it, even among family members, even in the guise of correcting family members' behavior, was pure loshon hora.

People are tempted to believe that discussion of family members falls outside the purview of Shmiras Haloshon. Yet this is the arena in which these halachos can actually do the most good. A family that is careful to keep criticism constructive—and private—builds a home that ultimately brings out the best in everyone.

# Sign of Greatness

A Chassidic Rebbe had been imprisoned in Siberia for seven years, when one Shabbos, a guard approached him and said, "Today, you are free. Just sign here." The Rebbe, unwilling to desecrate Shabbos, refused to sign. So, the guard turned instead to an old Jew standing near the Rebbe. He made the old man the same offer, but he also declined.

"Sign," the Rebbe told him.

But the man wouldn't. The Rebbe said, "Give me the pen. I'll sign for him."

The guard was now utterly perplexed. The Rebbe explained that he, himself, could withstand the remaining year of imprisonment that lay before him. His life wasn't in danger, so Shabbos couldn't be desecrated for him. But the old man was a different story; he wouldn't have lasted. The guard, awed by this act of human greatness, let both men go.
